**DOUG ISENBERG PARTICIPATES ON PANEL ON
SUPREME COURT'S LANDMARK INTERNET FILE-SHARING CASE**

ATLANTA, September 22, 2005 – Attorney Doug Isenberg, founder of GigaLaw.com and The GigaLaw Firm, participated in a panel discussion organized by Lawcast on the landmark Supreme Court case on Internet file-sharing, *Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer Studios v. Grokster*. The panel was recorded and will be distributed to subscribers of Lawcast's audio legal news service for lawyers the week of September 26, 2005.

Isenberg, a world-renown authority on Internet law and an adjunct professor of computer and cyberspace law, has written and spoken extensively on numerous Internet legal issues, including file-sharing. He appeared on-air on CNN when the *Grokster* opinion was published by the Supreme Court in June 2005. In the opinion, the Supreme Court held that file-sharing services could under certain circumstances be held liable for copyright infringement committed by their users.

Isenberg was joined on the panel by Charles Baker of Houston, an attorney who represents StreamCast Networks (distributor of the Morpheus file-sharing software and a defendant in the *Grokster* case); and intellectual property attorney Ian Ballon of Palo Alto, Calif. The panel was moderated by David Weisenfeld, editor-in-chief of Lawcast.

In addition to representing technology companies and copyright owners interested in the *Grokster* case and its impact, Isenberg advises clients on other intellectual property, technology and Internet legal issues. He is the author of the book *The GigaLaw Guide to Internet Law* (Random House) and serves as a domain name panelist for the World Intellectual Property Organization, the largest arbiter of domain name disputes, based in Geneva.
