**DOUG ISENBERG TO SPEAK ON  
“COPYRIGHT LAW AND MEDIA DISTRIBUTION ON THE INTERNET”  
AT GEORGIA STATE UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF LAW**

ATLANTA, March 6, 2006 – Attorney Doug Isenberg, founder of GigaLaw.com and The GigaLaw Firm, is scheduled to speak at the first “Intellectual Property Hot Topics” panel at Georgia State University (GSU) College of Law, on April 13, 2006. The topic for the program is “Copyright Law and Media Distribution on the Internet.”

Joining Isenberg on the panel will be Professor Michael Landau, director of the intellectual property law program at GSU; Les Seagraves, chief privacy officer and assistant general counsel at EarthLink; and Shachar Oren, founder and CEO of Neurotic Media. The panel will be moderated by Daniel Sieberg, technology correspondent at CNN.

Isenberg, an adjunct professor of computer and cyberspace law at GSU, is a *cum laude* graduate of the GSU College of Law and a founding member of its Intellectual Property Advisory Board. In 2005, he was named a “Georgia Super Lawyers Rising Star.”

The April 13 program will be held from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. at the GSU Student Center Court Salon.
