**DOUG ISENBERG PROVIDES INTERNET LAW UPDATE
AT INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY LAW CONFERENCE**

ATLANTA, April 28, 2006 – Attorney Doug Isenberg, founder of GigaLaw.com and The GigaLaw Firm, spoke today at the second annual SpringPosium intellectual property and technology law conference in Young Harris, Georgia. The topic of Isenberg’s presentation was “Internet Law Update,” which focused on recent trends in domain name disputes; keyword bidding legal issues; the Intellectual Property Protection Act of 2006; and the Child Pornography and Obscenity Prevention Amendments of 2006.

Isenberg is also an adjunct professor of computer and cyberspace law at Georgia State University College of Law and has been named a “Georgia Super Lawyers Rising Star.”

Isenberg, chair (2005-06) of the Intellectual Property Law Section of the State Bar of Georgia, practices intellectual property, technology and Internet law at The GigaLaw Firm in Atlanta (<http://www.GigaLawFirm.com>). Isenberg also serves as an adjunct professor at Georgia State University College of Law and is a world-renown authority on Internet law and serves as a domain name panelist for the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO), the largest arbiter of domain name disputes, based in Geneva.
